DISCIPLE-MAKING AT HOME: STARTING WITH HOW - PART 7

On the topic of starting family devotion according to **Deuteronomy 6:4-9**, I have recommended including (a) Bible reading; (b) discussion, teaching, and meditation; and (c) prayer as the primary activities in the last article. I will dive deeper into Bible reading this week.

The Bible is diverse and contains many genres, or kinds of writings. For example, the Old Testament is full of exciting stories of heroes, normal people with flaws, passionate prophets who cry out for their nation, battles, and personal struggles. There are narratives, prophecies, and biographies as well as poetic literature.

These are the common ways to approach Bible reading with your family:

Read a paragraph or chapter each day. Many families follow this plan for its simplicity. You can read consecutively through a book, devotion. Everyone can take and understanding about and take on one or two passages in each turn reading, and share their thoughts the passage.
